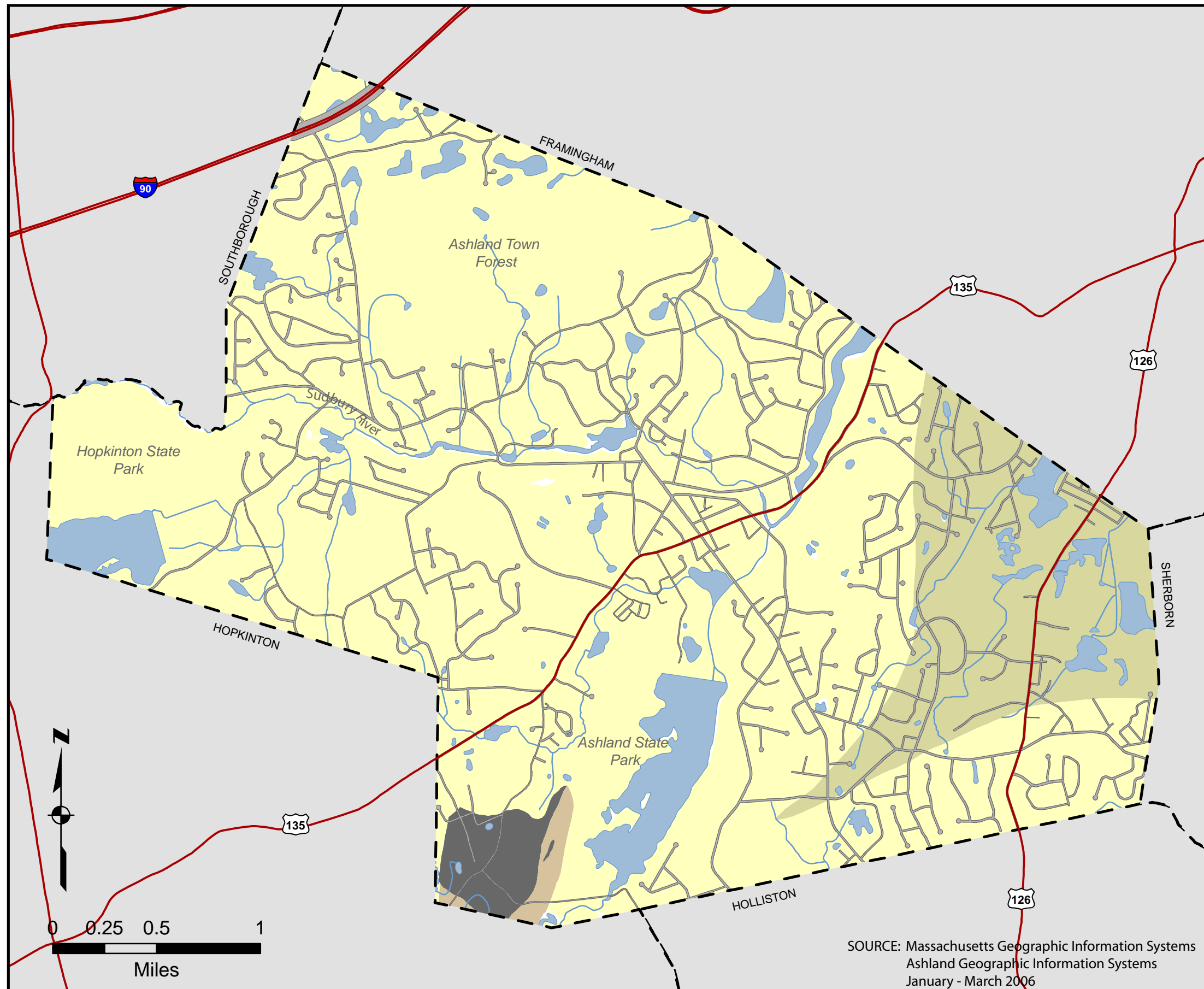


Map 4.1 Bedrock Geology
